JAPANESE (JPS) – Year 10

Subject Outline:

The Year 10 Japanese course is an exciting program that integrates the study of the Tourism Industry with the Japanese language. This concept was awarded a Languages Innovations Grant in 2016 and builds on learning from Year 9 Japanese to prepare students for work skills and senior schooling in this subject.

Future employment opportunities and skills shortages within the Tourism sector have prompted the Year 10 Japanese program to evolve into the KLIP Program (Kepnock Languages Integrated Program). Students have the opportunity to learn how languages can be applied practically within our region, state, and country within the tourism employment sector.
