HISTORY (HIS) – Year 10 Subject Outline:

The Modern World and Australia

The Year 10 curriculum provides a study of the history of the modern world and Australia from 1918 to the present, with an emphasis on Australia in its global context. The twentieth century became a critical period in Australia's social, cultural, economic and political development. This is a time of political turmoil, global conflict and international cooperation which has led to the strong position Australia finds itself placed today in the Asia-Pacific region as well as globally.

Course Content:

Students study History for one (1) semester only.
